Four-year BSN Admission Requirements for Mount Carmel College of Nursing

- Graduation from an accredited high school (or GED)
- Recommended cumulative grade point average (GPA): High school GPA: 3.0 Direct Admit, 2.75 Provisional Admit Transfer GPA: 2.8 Direct Admit, 2.5 Provisional Admit
- Recommended ACT of 20 or SAT of 950
- Minimum grade of "C" or higher in the following high school course requirements (a grade of "C" minus ("C-") will not be accepted):
 - English, 4 courses
 - College Preparatory Math, 3 courses (including Algebra II)
 - Laboratory Science (Chemistry and Biology required), 3 courses
 - Social Science, 3 courses
 - Foreign Language (American Sign Language is an option), 2 courses (Recommended)
 - Visual or Performing Arts, 1 course (Recommended)
 - Required courses not completed in high school may be completed at college level.
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) scores, if English is not your native language (a minimum score of 79 on the internet-based test is required)

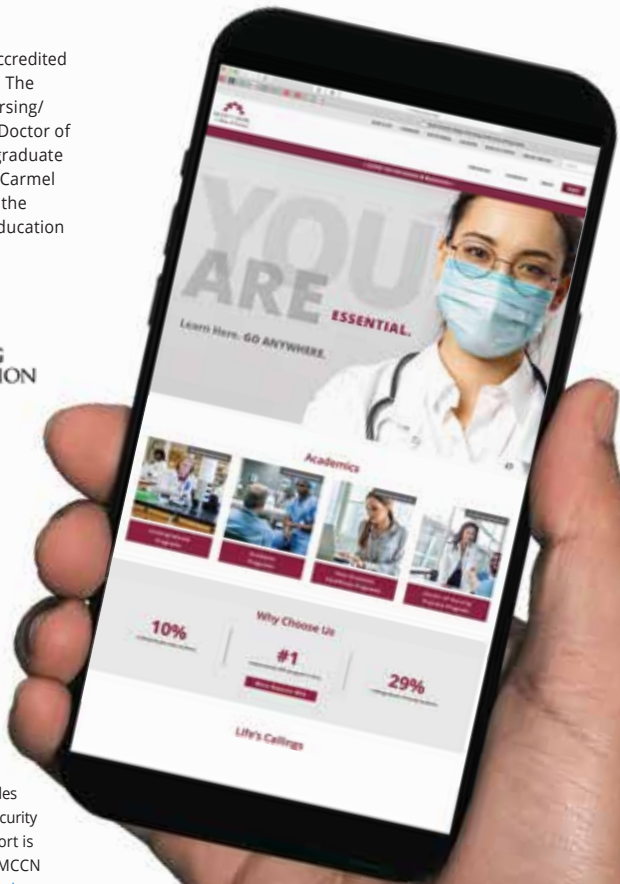
